RE: **NOTICE OF INTENTION TO AMEND THE FPPC CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE
OF BETA HEALTHCARE GROUP RISK MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that BETA Healthcare Group Risk Management Authority (BETARMA), pursuant to the authority vested in it by section 87306 of the Government Code, proposes amendment to its Conflict of Interest Code. A comment period has been established commencing on June 26, 2026, and closing on August 14, 2026. All inquiries should be directed to the contact listed below.

BETARMA proposes to amend its Conflict of Interest Code to include employee positions that involve the making, or participation in the making, of decisions that may foreseeably have a material effect on any financial interest, as set forth in subdivision (a) of section 87302 of the Government Code. The amendment carries out the purposes of the law and no other alternative would do so and be less burdensome to affected persons.

Changes to the Conflict of Interest Code include:

- Removing the title of Controller
- Adding the title of Senior Director of Risk Management and Patient Safety
- Adding the title of Senior Director of Risk Management and Employee Safety
- Revising the title of Director of Underwriting Operations to Senior Director of Underwriting Operations
- Adding the title of Director of Underwriting, Professional Liability
- Revising the title of Director of Workers' Compensation Services to Director of Business Services, Workers' Compensation
- Removing the title of Underwriting Manager
- Updates to Disclosure Categories

Any interested person may submit written comments relating to the proposed amendment by submitting them no later than August 14, 2026, or at the conclusion of the public hearing, if requested, whichever comes later. At this time, no public hearing is scheduled. A person may request a hearing no later than August 14, 2026.

BETARMA has determined that the proposed amendments:

1. Impose no mandate on local agencies or school districts.
2. Impose no costs or savings on any state agency.
3. Impose no costs on any local agency or school district that are required to be reimbursed under Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division 4 of Title 2 of the Government Code.
4. Will not result in any nondiscretionary costs or savings to local agencies.
5. Will not result in any costs or savings in federal funding to the state.
6. Will not have any potential cost impact on private persons, businesses or small businesses.
